THINGS YOU CAN DO TO ENHANCE LEARNING AT HOME:

- 1. Spring is here! We are learning about spring weather, by talking and exploring the trees, flowers birds etc. Teach your children how to dress for the weather. Talk about changes we will begin to see with the trees, grass, rain, the wind, etc. Ask your child if they notice anything different outside? Is it windy, rainy, or sunny?
- 2. Go outside to play every opportunity you get. Enjoy the rain with rain boots and rain jackets! Kids love puddle jumping!
- 3. Make a special time to read with your child each day. Ask them questions as your reading. Find books they enjoy. Here are two a great article on language development:

- 4. Encourage your child to read a story to you that you have read to them often. Help your child to look at the picture to tell you something about the story. Praise your child for a job well done.
- 5. Find ways to incorporate math each day, count snacks as you give them to your child, count your fingers, count to play hide and seek, etc. Here is an insightful article on supporting your child's math skills:

- 6. Encourage your young toddler to sit on the potty. Establish a time that they sit on the potty each day before bedtime.
- 7. Talk about healthy habits such as brushing teeth, eating healthy foods, and spending time outside daily.
- 8. Read scripture to your child often. Let them see you reading the Bible. Ask them questions about the story and share how it helps us to know and love God more.

9. Pray with your child. Let them hear you talk to the Lord, encourage them to try to participate in prayer with you.

MISCELLANEOUS INFO:

- If your child has a fever or rash, we ask that you keep your child at home and visit the pediatrician before returning to childcare.
- Please make sure all blankets, sippy cups, snacks, bags, etc., are labeled with the child's name.
- We aim to play outside each day, please make sure your child has clothes that can get dirty, or clothes they can change into.

Hello, Kindergarten Families! This year is just flying by!!! I cannot believe it is already Easter break. Thank you so much to the ones that sent in snacks and games and party stuff!! We had a great day!! Thank you so much to Brieanna, she has been such a great help with every party!!

I am sending home copies of each child's primary fair. Please practice each page and encourage them to be clear and well expressed. Continue reviewing and practicing concepts with your child. After the break we will begin testing, so please make sure your child is getting plenty of sleep and ready for their day at school.

We are also enjoying the warmer days, hopefully the next few days will be beautiful.

- Kindergarten is hard at work practicing their primary fair presentations. We welcome any parent, friend, or family that would like to see them present. Make sure they have their display stuffed animal or something to show representing their animal the day of the presentation. The primary fair will be April 30th.
- In phonics we have been concentrating on blends, such as bl, ch, st, th. Blends have been a tough new concept, so as you go through the week and see signs with different letters they can blend, point it out to your child and practice them.

First and Second Grade

I have sent home the facts your student has chosen to focus on for their primary fair presentation. Students will want to practice reading their facts at home to work on their presentation. We do not have much time to do this with a break, so this will have to be a focus at home. I sent home the materials for those who want to make display boards. Please make sure their Bible verse is displayed on their boards. Primary fair is coming up at the end of the month.

1st Grade

<u>Reading/Phonics/Spelling</u>: We finished up chapter 19 spelling test last week. We are not starting our next chapter of reading and spelling until we come back from Easter break. We have been doing practice testing this week.

Math: We will be getting ready for our addition with double digit numbers test hopefully before break. Then we will move on to double digit subtraction after Easter break. The students are doing well with it. Please keep working on practicing adding and subtracting at home. Practicing flashcards to help students learn to memorize their facts.

2nd Grade Math and ELA

We have our test on Monday over Unit #28. The students have their list written in their assignment books. In reading class, we have begun our third reader. We have been working hard on our projects this week.

We are borrowing with subtraction in Math and will have a test next week. This skill is bit tricky for most.

1st and 2nd Bible

We have been focusing on the true meaning of Easter and the Easter story.

<u> 1st and 2nd Unit – Science</u>

We are just finishing up our chick unit. We hatched 9 chicks and have had so much fun along the way. We will be moving onto a new unit once we return from break.

Third & Fourth Grade

This past week we spent time each day learning about what Jesus was experiencing leading up to his death and resurrection on the cross. If you can, keep talking to your kids at home, it is so important that each one recognizes the significance of what Jesus did for each of us.

Students are continuing their work on primary fair topics. We are starting to practice in class.

Some things that you can work on at home with your student are multiplication, spelling words, and Bible verses. There are also educational videos and links on iChampion!

Third Grade Math: Third graders are working on multiplication in school. Please work on fact families 1-8 at home. Students just finished a test on counting money, their next chapter is on polygons, solid figures, similar and congruent shapes.

Fourth Grade Math: Fourth graders are reviewing multiplication. Please review multiplication facts at home. Students have been working on adding and subtracting mixed numbers, please work on this with them at home, it has been particularly challenging for most of them.

Third Grade Spelling: No spelling this week, we will pick up with unit 34 the week after Easter break.

Fourth Grade Spelling: No spelling this week, we will pick up with unit 34 the week after Easter break.

Handwriting: Students are beginning to write Bible verses in cursive!

<u>Grammar:</u> We are learning about pronouns!

Writing: We are working on primary fair projects.

<u>Reading Group A</u>: Reading group A is reading and learning about informational text.

<u>Reading Group B</u>: Reading group B is reading learning about myths in different cultures.

<u>History</u>: Students are learning about Clara Barton. Students will be getting ready for a test after Easter break.

Science: Students are starting a new unit on waves. They will be learning about forms of energy that are transferred through waves such as light and sound.

Bible: This past week we focused on Jesus, his death and resurrection.

Language Arts Classes

5^{th/6th Grade}

We are learning about verbs in English and writing an essay on the theme "The Best Season of All." In literature, we are reading a new novel together, *A Wrinkle in Time* by Madeleine L'Engle.

7^{th/}8th Grade

We are learning about various phrases, including prepositional phrases, adjectival phrases, and adverbial phrases, and how to expand and improve sentences using these phrases. Students

have begun working on a problem and solution essay. In literature we are reading the novel, *The Pearl* by John Steinbeck.

The American Novel 11/12

Students are reading and analyzing major works by American authors. All students are reading **The Giver** by Lois Lowry. Activities include extensive plot development techniques and plot mapping as well as special projects chosen by the students.

Elements of Literature 9/10

We are tackling such topics as sound and syntax, allusion and symbol, irony, and imaginative comparisons in various genres of literature, including drama, poetry, and short stories. We are finishing up Shakespeare's *Julius Caesar* in class. Our next novel we will read is *The Red Badge of Courage* by Stephen Crane.

<u>Science</u> 5/6 Science

The students did a great job with their cell models! We are now studying plant and animal classification. Ask your students what they have learned.

<u>Geometry</u>

Shapes, Logic, and Proofs, oh my!

<u>Math</u>

5/6 Math with Mrs. Marker @ tiarrah_marker@champion.org

Started Geometry introduction with angles, rays, lines, and line relationships. Will be reviewing types of angles, triangles and circular degrees before going into Polygons when we get back from break. Have an extremely Happy Resurrection Day!
