

## NORMAL RISK

- Masks should be worn according to existing orders
- Extra textbooks, e-books, Center devices will be used when possible to avoid sharing
- Appropriate training will be provided, focusing on germs and health safety
- Must be kept home from school when sick/having flu or COVID-19 symptoms

- Masks should be worn according to existing orders
- Provide extra cleaning supplies and maintain changes in physical space to optimize social distancing
- Isolate students and send them home if they show symptoms/have a fever
- Focus on creatively engaging students while keeping them safe

Everyone is encouraged to use good medical and hygiene practices and should receive COVID-19 testing if they are symptomatic. Parents and staff will be responsible for evaluating the mask orders and determining if they/their child(ren) meet one of the exemptions.

## ELEVATED RISK

- Encouraged to increase usage of masks/face shields
- Will not congregate in groups larger than 25
- Flexible instruction and tutoring options will be available to accommodate vulnerable students
- Field trips will be limited

- Encouraged to increase usage of masks/face shields
- Will take student and staff temperatures at the beginning of every day
- Schedule additional cleaning and make sure extra precautions are taken to keep the buildings clean and safe

This stage could be triggered by a county entering a local heightened alert phase, other local heightened alerts, or confirmed COVID-19 cases in the CCS community. Everyone is encouraged to use good medical and hygiene practices and should receive COVID-19 testing if they are symptomatic.

## HIGH RISK

- Collaborative work and group sizes will be further reduced
- Increased virtual class options will be available for students who have to miss school or who are vulnerable
- No trips/travel
- Partial school shutdown if enough students in a program/class are sick

- Temperature checks for students and staff will be done more frequently
- Prepare to transition and consolidate students/classrooms to one building, pending county shutdowns
- Work from home options available
- Focus on ways to stop the spread of COVID-19 while still providing quality education

This stage could be triggered by a governmental shutdown, an outbreak in one of our buildings, or significant absences that make school unmanageable. Everyone is encouraged to use good medical and hygiene practices and should receive COVID-19 testing if they are symptomatic.

We will be doing our best to keep our students and staff safe, while continuing to provide appropriate and effective education. We remain committed to prayerful flexibility and organizational agility that honors our mission.
